Medicare Part A alone does not have any prescription coverage. Part A & B have partial coverage, the amount covered is partly dependent on the pharmacy and if the pt is enrolled in new Medicare prescription or drug company discount cards. *****DSHS** coverage is variable. Some folks have no medication coverage at all. If the pt does have prescription coverage, they do not need to pay anything out of pocket at all.
